Be Safe On The Trail


1. Tell someone your hiking location and trail plan.
2. Bring a trail map and compass; be sure to know how to use the compass.
3. Bring a phone in case of emergency.
4. Dress appropriately for the day's weather.
5. Bring plenty of water. Bring a snack if you plan to be out for a while.
6. Wear bug spray, tick repellent, sunscreen, and hat.
7. Bring small first aid kit that includes bandaids, antiseptic, tweezers, extra sunscreen.
8. Bring a whistle in case of emergency. Phones are not always an option!

Avoid Poisonous Plants

IDENTIFYING POISONOUS PLANTS

POISON IVY HAS THREE POINTY LEAVES AND CHANGES COLOR IN FALL. IT CLIMBS TREES AND BUSHES.

POISON OAK ALSO HAS THREE LEAVES AND CHANGES COLOR IN FALL. IT IS USUALLY FOUND AS A BUSH.

POISON OAK

POISON SUMAC HAS BETWEEN 7-13 LEAVES. IT GROWS IN WET, MARSHY AREAS, AND AROUND RIVERS AND PONDS.



POISON SUMAC

Preventing Tick Bites*

- * Stay on the trail
- * Use repellent
- * Wear light colored clothing
- * Long sleeves and long pants highly recommended!
- * Do a full body tick check- don't forget behind your ears, belly button, armpits, and your hair!
